Wikipedia (/ˌwɪkɪˈpidiə/ [ⓘ] *wik-ih-PEE-dee-ə* or /ˌwɪki-/ [ⓘ] *wik-ee-*) is a free content, multilingual online encyclopedia written and maintained by a community of volunteer contributors through a model of open collaboration, using a wiki-based editing system. Wikipedia is the largest and most-read reference work in history,^[3] and is consistently one of the 15 most popular websites as ranked by Alexa; as of 2021, it was ranked as the 13th most popular site.^{[3][4]} The project carries no advertisements and is hosted by the Wikimedia Foundation, an American non-profit organization funded mainly through small donations.^[5]

Wikipedia was launched on January 15, 2001, by Jimmy Wales^[6] and Larry Sanger; Sanger coined its name as a blending of "wiki" and "encyclopedia".^{[7][8]} Initially available only in English, versions in other languages were quickly developed. Combined, Wikipedia's editions comprise more than 56 million articles, that attract an average of around 2 billion unique device visits and receive more than 17 million edits per month, or develop at a rate of 1.9 edits per second.^{[9][10]}
