This is a good form of communication if you want to share your ideas with a wide audience. It allows you to connect with anyone else who has access to the web.



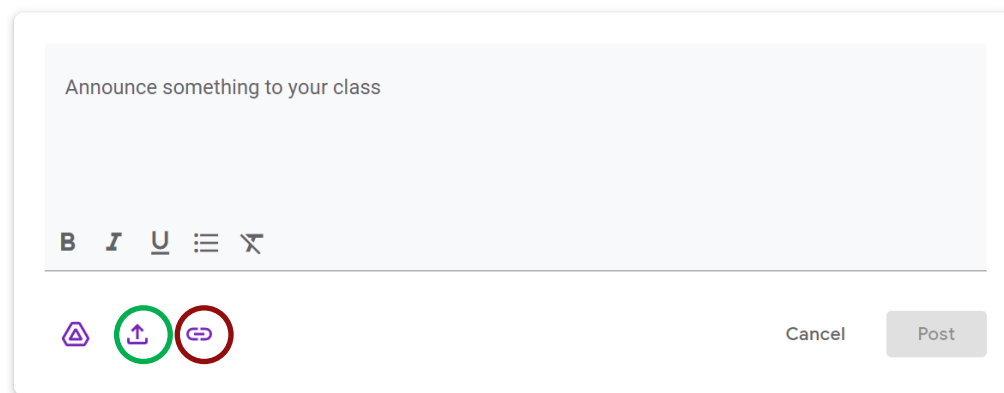

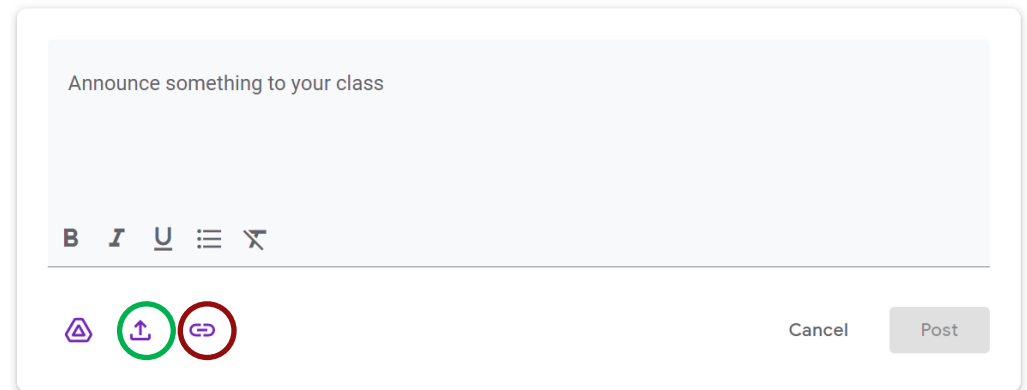
