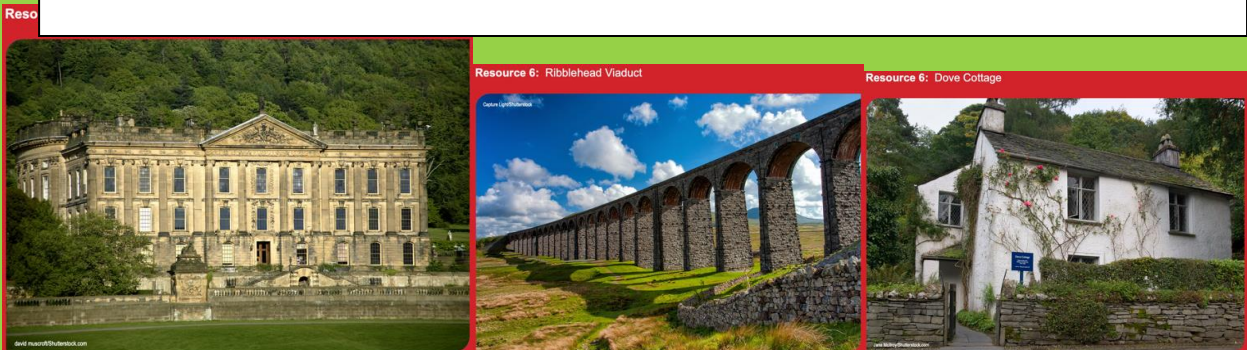
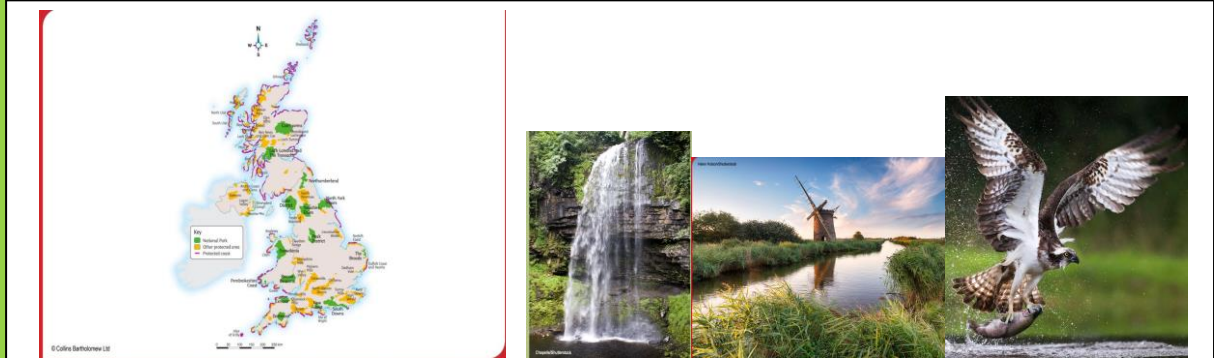
Geography: Who are Britain's National Parks for?

In this unit, pupils will learn about the 15 National Parks in Great Britain, what they are and why they are important in conserving areas of outstanding natural beauty and the cultural traditions of the area in which they are situated. They will study features of National Parks on a national level before comparing them to a National Park in the US which they have studied in lower KS2.

Key Vocabulary

Images:

National Park	A national park is a natural park containing natural or developed land in use for conservation purposes, created and protected by national governments.
United Kingdom	The United Kingdom is made up of England, Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales. It is an island nation north western Europe.
Conservation/conserve	Nature conservation is focused on protecting species, landscapes, geographical features or cultural traditions in an area.
Protected areas	Locations which receive protection because of their ecological or cultural values.
Region	Regions of England are the highest tier of sub-national division in England. There are 9 regions of the UK: (North East, North West, Yorkshire and the Humber, East Midlands, West Midlands, East of England, London, South East and South West)
landscape	A landscape is part of the earth's surface that can be viewed at one time from one place.
Cultural tradition	Values, practices and traditions of people in an area of society. They make up the identity of peoples and places and include their beliefs and values.
Heritage	This includes natural and built landscapes, objects and culture (music, art, monuments etc) as well as beliefs.
environment	The surroundings in which a person or animal lives.
Economic activity	Ways in which an area creates goods or services to create jobs and industry.
Land use	The human use of land in an area
