
Key Vocabulary: Florida—What is the sunshine state really like?	
theme park: a park with various rides, games and amusements, all based around a theme or group of themes	peninsula : a piece of land that is surrounded by water on three sides
	equator : an imaginary circle around the centre of the Earth, halfway between the North and South poles
tourist : a person visiting another place for pleasure, often on holiday	
Florida: the state that is furthest south east in the United States of America. It is famous for theme parks.	key : a list explaining symbols or colours on a map
	conservation : the protection of natural things eg animals, plants, land
weather: describing the temperature, precipitation and clouds at a given time	
	United States of America: a country in North America which is split into 50 separate states or areas
climate : the average pattern of the weather from year to year	
precipitation : water that falls from the clouds eg rain, hail, snow or sleet	endangered : animals that are at risk of becoming extinct (gone forever)


