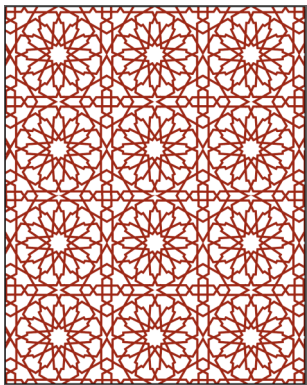

### Art—Texture and Pattern

#### Key Vocabulary: Texture and Pattern

|   |   |
|---|---|
| <b>texture:</b> the way something feels or looks like it feels. | <b>space:</b> the parts around, between, and within lines and shapes.           |
| <b>pattern:</b> repetition of a design, shape or object.        | <b>design:</b> a decorative pattern.  |
| <b>print:</b> transfer a design or pattern to a surface.        | <b>grid:</b> lines to form squares or rectangles.                               |
| <b>impression:</b> a mark impressed on a surface.               | <b>line:</b> a mark that goes between two points taking any form along the way. |

#### Famous artists who use texture and pattern in their work



#### Piet Mondrian

A Dutch artist who lived from 1872-1944. He was an important artist in abstract art which doesn't try to show actual objects.



#### Victor Vasarely

A French-Hungarian artist who lived from 1906-1997. He was one of the first to make 'op art' which is abstract art which creates an optical illusion.



#### Bridget Riley

A British artist born in 1931. She is an important artist in 'op art'.



#### Romero Britto

A Brazilian artist born in 1963. He combines cubism, pop art and graffiti art and uses vibrant colours and bold patterns.
