Key Vocabulary: Anti-Bullying

Bullying: deliberately hurtful behaviour done several times on purpose	tease: making fun of someone by saying hurtful things
Discrimination: treating somebody differently or unfairly	strategy: a plan or method of dealing with a situation
Bully: a person who frightens and hurts others	victim: someone who is hurt by the words or actions of others

The definition of bullying is:

Deliberately hurtful behaviour which can include physical or verbal abuse



Done several times on purpose over a long period of time



Involves an imbalance of power where a person is treated differently because they might be different



People sometimes get bullied because they are different

Different colour

Different religion

Different look



Strategies to combat bullying

There are several strategies which include: ignoring the bullying (it might stop if you don't react); staying calm and walking away; assertively telling the bullies how you feel and telling them to stop or if they don't work then tell a trusted adult.
