Key Vocabulary: Form and Sculpture

3D Shape: 3D shapes are shapes with three dimensions, such as width, height and depth. An example of a 3D shape is a prism or a sphere.

Paper Mache: A material that is made of paper mixed with water, glue, and other substances and that hardens as it dries.

Sculpture: A 3D work of art like a statue that is made by changing its shape from a medium such as clay or wood.

Shadow: A dark area where light from a light source is blocked by an opaque object.

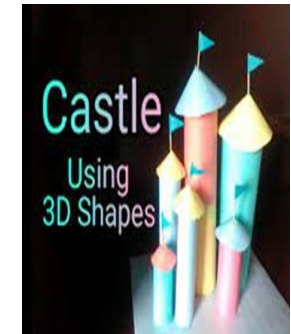
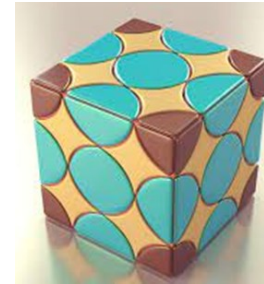
Space: Space is the element of art that refers to the area between and around objects.

Tone: The lightness or darkness of a colour (hence dark and light tones).

Overlap: Overlapping in art is the placement of objects over one another in order to create the illusion of depth.

Construction: The process of building or making something. For example to construct a sculpture out of 3D shapes..
