



Key Vocabulary: We are Presenters

Green Screen: video technique in which the bright green pixels of each frame in a video are replaced by pixels from a background image.

Creative Commons: a special scheme that allows things from the internet to be used like pictures without needing permission.

Pixel: a small square dot that makes up a digital image.

Resolution: the number of pixels that make up an image or frame of video—the higher the number, the more detail you can see.

Research: to find information about a particular topic.

Search engine: a way of finding links to websites by using key words to get you to the right websites.

Rushes: unedited video footage from a video recording.

Edit: to correct mistakes, add and delete things to make something like a video better!

Green Screen

The weather presenter stands in front of a big green screen, and points as if they can see the map. In reality, the presenter is simply pointing at a green canvas. The television company then apply a 'chroma key' filter to replace everything that is green with another image – in this case, the weather map. This technology is no longer just for television companies or weather reporters. Now you can apply the same effect using your iPhone or iPad using an app.
